Reading changed the founder's life - from a disengaged school student to a successful teacher, to a leadership scholar, and to a successful school leader across a range of roles and responsibilities.

This programme exists to help leaders rediscover the power of shared reading.

When leaders read from the same book - and often the same page - they build shared understanding, stronger alignment, and a clearer path towards shared goals for students, schools, and organisations.

Why this programme matters

- Builds a culture of reflective dialogue and shared professional growth.
- Creates shared language, shared meaning, and stronger leadership alignment.
- Helps leaders connect ideas from reading to practical school improvement.
- Strengthens collegial trust, empathy, and thoughtful professional conversation.
- Encourages leaders to pause, think deeply, and lead with greater purpose.

Why leaders sign up

- Leadership can become fast, reactive, and overly operational. This programme creates rare space to slow down and think well.
- Shared reading gives leaders a strong common reference point for conversation, challenge, and next-step action.
- It supports not only strategic thinking, but also personal renewal, perspective, and professional wellbeing.

The deeper purpose

This is more than a book discussion. It is a professional culture initiative designed to help leaders think together, speak with greater clarity, and align more intentionally around what matters most.

When leaders learn together, they are more likely to build trust, develop shared priorities, and lead with consistency across teams and campuses.

Participants gain

- broader perspectives for wiser decisions
- stronger dialogue and team trust
- practical ideas for everyday leadership challenges
- renewed motivation to keep learning and growing

Leaders who read together build shared understanding, stronger alignment, and wiser action.

How the programme works

1. Co-select a book

Choose a text linked to leadership, motivation, culture, organisational learning, or improvement priorities.

3. Meet monthly

Participate in 4 to 5 facilitated sessions of 60-90 minutes for thoughtful discussion, dialogue, and reflection.

2. Read and reflect

Engage progressively between sessions and consider what the reading means for your own leadership context.

4. Apply the learning

Translate insights into practical action for leadership, culture, team development, and school improvement.

Suggested areas of dialogue

- leadership, culture, and team trust
- motivation, resilience, and wellbeing
- decision-making and moral purpose
- school improvement and organisational learning
- developing others and sustaining leadership growth

Why mentoring and book-based dialogue work

- They create a rhythm of reflection that is often missing in busy leadership roles.
- They strengthen confidence, judgment, empathy, and adaptability.
- They help leaders move from isolated thinking to collective insight and aligned action.
- They often spark a multiplier effect as participants go on to mentor and grow others.

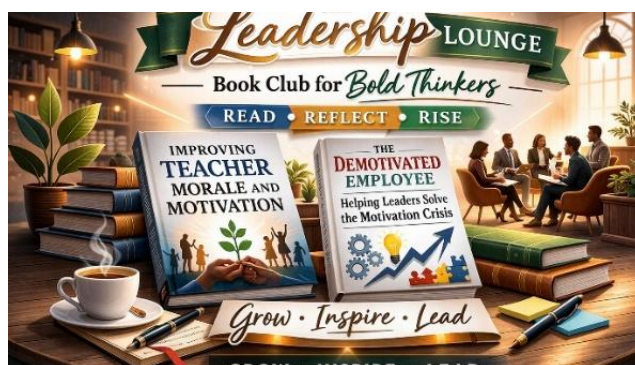
